**Wisdom from Above** Reading: Matthew 2:1-12 Epiphany/C 1-5-2025 By the Rev. Karen Faye Siegfriedt; St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Atascadero CA

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany by reading the story of the magi from the gospel of Matthew: "In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising and have come to pay him homage. When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him." When leaders become fearful and their power is threatened, some will do anything to stop the potential threat. Herod was no exception and aimed to kill the Christ child at any cost with no regard for the innocent bystanders. This response continues today as narcissistic, power hungry, insecure leaders throughout the world corrupt and destroy the creatures of God.

But what stands out for me most in today's gospel, is the final sentence of the reading: "And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, the [wise men] left for their own country by another road." Where did these men get this wisdom? How did they know that Herod had evil intentions from such a brief visit with him? Wisdom is the ability to use knowledge and experience to make good decisions and judgments. Wisdom involves insight, discernment, listening to a variety of voices, paying attention to intuition and sound judgment in various situations. For Christians, wisdom comes from God.

Each year, I collect wisdom sayings that have crossed my path during the past 12 months. It is a spiritual discipline for me to reflect on these wisdom sayings articulated by others whom I believe are inspired by God and God's dream for a new humanity. These are the ones whose principles are based on compassion, truth, peace, generosity, and the dignity of every human being. What follows, is a treasure chest of wisdom gleaned from 2024:

*Hope* is the Conviction that the future holds new possibilities that are not evident in the present. - "Even the darkest night will end and the sun will rise." (Victor Hugo)

- "I want to be part of a people who see the darkness, know it's real, and then light a candle anyway." (Sarah Bessey)

- "Your mind will always believe everything you tell it. Feed it hope. Feed it truth. Feed it with love."

- "Do not be dismayed by the brokenness of the world. All things break. And all things can be mended. Not with time, as they say, but with intention. So go. Love intentionally, extravagantly, unconditionally. The broken world waits in darkness for the light that is you."

#### Joy is an attitude of the heart which soothes even in the most sorrowful of situations.

- "Choosing to have joy is not naively thinking everything will be easy. It is courageously believing that there is still hope even when things get hard." MHN

- "Your soul is beaming with flowers. It's time to stop watering your scars." (Pavana)

- "If we laugh and sing a little as we fight the good fight of freedom, it makes it all go easier. I will not allow my life's light to be determined by the darkness around me." (Sojourner Truth)
