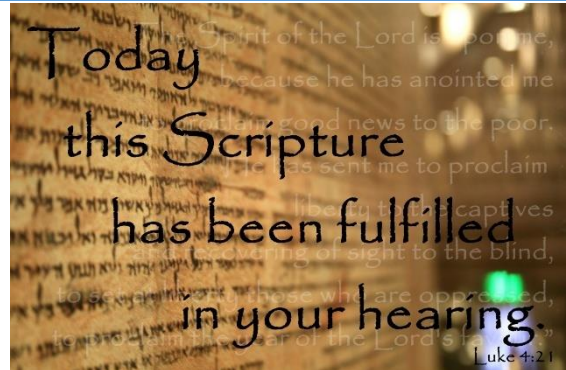

Dear friends and neighbors,

The Wednesday morning Bible Study Group whose members weekly meet at St. James from 10:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. cordially invite you to join them for a screening of the "Dead Sea Scrolls" beginning on Wednesday, October 8th 2025.



Narrated by Dr. Gary A Rendsburg, who occupies the Laurie Chair in Jewish History at Rutgers University, this series of 24 lectures tell the remarkable story of the scrolls' discovery, research, and publication. The first scrolls were found by accident by a Bedouin shepherd boy who was chasing a stray goat that had wandered into one of the Qumran caves. Scholars systematically explored other caves in the region until 11 individual caves yielded 930 texts from the 3rd century B.C.E. through 68 C.E. that provide an unprecedented view of Jewish history, culture, and religion from before and during the time of Jesus. Join us for a unique experience and adventure as we learn about the great diversity of rich material from Qumran.

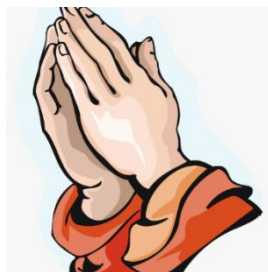
