

Dear friends,

This past Sunday I was able to be celebrate Eucharist at St. Luke's and celebrate one year of service as your priest-in-charge; THANK YOU so very much for the generous and thoughtful gift basket!! Ever since meeting the folks of St. Luke's I have been so very grateful for your love and care! And then, after worship, we sat down together for our Vestry of the Whole meeting, and I shared some hard news with the parish: after a great deal of prayer and discernment, I've made the decision that I'm unable to continue on as your ¼ time priest, my last day with you will be 12/31. This is certainly a heart-breaking decision for me, and one not

taken lightly, or made swiftly. This ¼ time call has been a new experience for me, and I have certainly wrestled with it over this past year – what seems as though it should work ('on paper') has proved to be a challenge for me, body, mind, and spirit – and, as the priest I am (which is the only kind of priest I can be!), I've learned it's not a sustainable form ministry for me.

This in no way limits the great love I have for St. Luke's, or the impact this parish has had on my own spiritual growth and development over this past year, for which I will always be grateful. St. Luke's is faithful and overflowing with love and care and it is my great privilege to continue to journey with you all through the end of this year.

Please do be part of the ongoing conversation on Tuesdays at 11am as we continue to think together about St. Luke's future, through Bible Study and through prayer, through strategic planning and group sharing – there is much to be done, and *everyone* is needed for this work!
